The Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) Grant Program, a cooperative effort of the Administration on Aging and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, was developed to assist states in their efforts to create a single, coordinated system of information and access for persons seeking long-term support to minimize confusion, enhance individual choice, and support informed decision making.

In December, 2007, The DC Office on Aging was given the task to develop, staff, and open the ADRC with collaboration from the District's health and human service agencies and community partners.

The DC ADRC mission is to assist the District's elderly and persons with disabilities in maximizing their independence and improving their quality of life by linking people with a broad range of quality services.

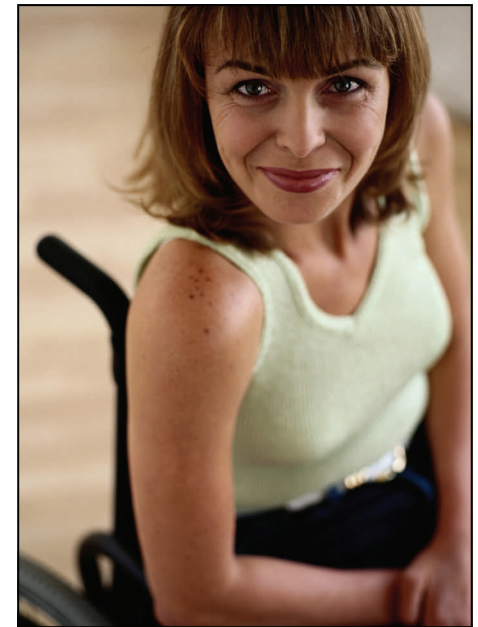
